Thomas said to him, “Lord, we do not know where you are going. How can we know the way?” Jesus said to him, “I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me.” John 14:5-6 (NRSV)



Spiritual Fullness in Christ: *“So then, just as you received Christ Jesus as Lord, continue to live your lives in him, rooted and built up in him, strengthened in the faith as you were taught, and overflowing with thankfulness.”* Colossians 2:6-7 (NIV)

November’s beautiful fall colors and cool air remind me Thanksgiving Day is not far off. It also reminds me we are to be thankful whatever our circumstances are. Colossians 2:6-7 affirms how thankful we should be...The phrase, *“overflowing with thankfulness,”* repeats itself over and over. The words *“overflowing”* and *“abounding,”* remind me of the Pilgrims first Thanksgiving. How did they pray and speak of abundance and blessings?

Jesus said, *“Out of the abundance of the heart, the mouth speaks.”* These words make me ask myself, *“What’s in my heart?”* Do I, do more complaining than giving thanks? Am I selfish? Do I only think of my needs? Am I filled with pride? Do I fail to give God the praise He is rightly due? Do I really live my life with gratitude and true thanksgiving?

Living a life of *“gratitude and true thanksgiving”* is the mark of a genuine Christian. Scriptures states, *“Give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God’s will for you in Christ Jesus”* (1 Thessalonians 5:18). Being truly thankful to God in all of our circumstances changes our hearts; it makes us look up in faith to God, rather than looking all around us in fear! Thanksgiving towards God and others motivates and helps us to fulfill the Great Commandment in our lives. Scripture states, *“We are to love God with all our heart, soul, mind, and strength, and to love our neighbor as our self”* (Luke 10:27). I cannot think of a better way to express God’s abounding love more than living a life of *“Gratefulness”* and *“Thanksgiving,”* not just on Thanksgiving Day but all year long!

Will your Thanksgiving Day be filled with gratefulness and thanksgiving? Will it be like the Pilgrims first Thanksgiving? On December 21, 1620 the Pilgrims landed at Plymouth Rock. Through the dead of winter the colony struggled with the poor living conditions and inadequate and insufficient amounts of food, their labor was strenuous, as they struggled physically in the bitter cold and freezing winds that chilled them to the bone. Many suffered rapid diseases...Nearly half the 102 Mayflower passengers did not live to see Cape Cod Bay in the Spring. Yet, despite all these severe trials and struggles, God who is "always faithful" sent Indians--Samoset, Squanto, and Massasoit--to help the English settlers plant and hunt and fish. The bountiful harvest that autumn led Governor Bradford to invite the Indians to celebrate God's goodness. The story is told that Ninety strong braves accepted the invitation to join the Pilgrims in a feast of Thanksgiving to God for His over-flowing abundance and blessings to His people.

God was faithful!

The Pilgrims lived by the bounty of the soil; no crop no food! The Pilgrims learn quickly just how dependent they were on God's providence and provisions for them. They learned, to thank God in the midst of the bitterness of past winters and to also thank Him for the winters of over-flowing abundant blessings too...At times, it is so easy for us to be ungrateful toward God. How often do we forget to acknowledge His goodness? Does this mean life is going to be perfect for us...certainly not. God says "Give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus" (1 Thessalonians 5:18). This "Thanksgiving" let us as a Church family, like the early Pilgrims lift our prayers of thanksgiving toward God together. "What shall I render unto the Lord for all His benefits toward me? I will take the cup of salvation, and call upon the name of the Lord." (Psalm 116:12-13). This Thanksgiving...Let us "Give thanks in all things." Let us be over-flowing in thankfulness and experience our spiritual fullness in Christ Jesus together!

Explanation of the Consecration of a Minister as Presbyter

Sunday- November 12 @ 3:00PM -has been officially set as the date and time for the Service of the Consecration of Presbyter for The Reverend Betty A. Helms (Pastor of New Hope Moravian Church Newton NC).

What are the Orders of the Moravian Church Ministry pertaining to Ordained Ministry?

The following description of the Moravian Orders of Ordained Ministry is taken from the Book of Order of the Moravian Church, Southern Province:

Ordination in General: The constituted orders of the ordained ministry in the Moravian Church are Deacon, Presbyter, and Bishop. Those who are ordained are authorized to administer the Sacraments in the Moravian Church.

Only the Provincial Elders' Conference or the Synod has the authority to commission ordination and consecration. In extending such a commission they are guided by careful consideration of the qualifications of the candidate. The Provincial Elders' Conference commissions the Bishop who is to officiate.

The Book of Order of the Moravian Church, Southern Province, outlines the meaning of ordination and delineates the three orders of the Moravian ministry: **Deacon, Presbyter and Bishop**: The ordained minister remains a servant of Christ and the Church as a whole, not merely to the congregation to which he/she is called. Even as Jesus Christ came not to be ministered unto but to minister, so his servants should be willing to minister wherever the Church calls them under the leading of the Holy Spirit. The ordination of Deacons and the consecration of Presbyters and Bishops are matters of function and not of status.

Presbyters

1. After a period of time, normally from three to five years, a Deacon may be consecrated as a Presbyter. Such a service of consecration shall represent on the part of the Church an act of spiritual encouragement and affirmation of the individual's witness in the ministry and approval of service rendered since ordination. For the individual Deacon it shall be an occasion of earnest heart-searching and renewed commitment to the ordained ministry of Christ and His Body, the Church.
2. The Provincial Elders' Conference, after consultation with the Deacon's designated counselor and the local church boards or other administrative board being served by the Deacon, approaches the Deacon concerning his/her readiness to accept consecration as a Presbyter.
3. The consecration of a Presbyter is an act of approval of the entire Moravian Unity. The candidate may choose the consecrating Bishop and the place for the service with the approval of the Provincial Elders' Conference.

We hope you will be able to attend this special service of consecration as we again recognize Reverend Betty A. Helms's call to ministry. Following the service the New Hope Church Family invites you to attend a reception in honor of Reverend Betty A. Helms and her family in the Fellowship Hall.

Chicken Pies- service to families who do not prepare this type item, a ready to cook nutritious meal.
Corner Table- Prepare a full hot meal (famous sloppy joes) and volunteer workers.
Donate items to Good Will/Salvation Army.
Collect annually for Salvation Army Christmas Stocking Program
Donate to orphanage in Romania, Funding of NC Surveyors Education Scholarship
Donate to Shrine Children's Hospital and Oxford Masonic Orphanage.
Hospice- Church donates annually as sustaining member, several volunteers, other donations
Collected & stored medical equipment, like walkers, crutches, bed side commode, etc for members
CMO/Preschool- total Christian outreach to families with this age students, several members volunteer
VBS- Open to public- majority are not our church kids.
Christmas Eve Services- Mostly for the public, folks come as family, Offering usually to ECCEM
Old Soldiers Reunion Booth- give out water bottles to thirsty participants.
Meals on Wheels- several members deliver under the name of New Hope Church.
"Souper Bowl of Caring" collection day of the Super Bowl. Proceeds go to Corner Table soup kitchen.
Host Red Cross Blood Drive- with volunteer helpers and donated snacks from the church.
Evangelism/showing God's love during opportunities at work and travel.

"Helping Hands Project": make 3-D hands for children

New Hope's Donation to MDR:



will help supplement the BWM tools already in the trailer. They will be used in the reconstruction of a local church and in the homes of members who have experienced damage to (and in some cases total loss of) their homes.

The BWM continues to receive generous donations to help us respond in light of the myriad of disasters in the last several weeks. Three distributions of MDR funds have been made to support the disaster areas.

A plan is now in place to start sending teams down to Texas, with opportunities to serve available now! An RV has been donated to BWM and is planned to be in place for housing teams soon.

We are just now receiving damage reports from the Caribbean churches and will update our website regularly. **


